### REPORT ON REVIEW OF INTERIM FINANCIAL INFORMATION

### I. GENERAL INFORMATION

### 1. Ownership form

Song Da Consulting Joint Stock Company (hereinafter referred to as "the Company" or "the Parent Company) is a joint stock company.

### 2. Operating fields

The Company operates in the service sector.

### 3. Business activities

The principal business activities of the Company include architecture and related technical consultancy.

### 4. Normal operating cycle

The normal operating cycle of the Company is within 12 months.

### 5. Structure of the Company

The Company has one subsidiary under the control of the Parent Company which is consolidated in these Interim Consolidated Financial Statements. During the period, there was no acquisition, disposal, or divestment in the subsidiary.

### Consolidated subsidiary

The Company has one subsidiary, Song Da Urban and Rural Development Joint Stock Company, located in Lai Xa Hamlet, Thanh Ha Commune, Hai Phong City. The principal business activities of this subsidiary include exploitation, treatment and supply of water. As of the balance sheet date, the Company's contribution rate in this subsidiary was 73.5% (unchanged from the beginning of the period), its voting and benefit rates were both equivalent to the contribution rate.

### 6. Statement on information comparability in the Consolidated Financial Statements

The corresponding figures of the previous period are comparable to those of the current period.

### 7. Employees

As of the balance sheet date, there were 153 employees working for the Company and its subsidiary (at the beginning of the year: 149 employees).

### II. FISCAL YEAR AND ACCOUNTING CURRENCY

### Fiscal year

The fiscal year of the Company and its subsidiary is from 1 January to 31 December annually.

### 2. Accounting currency unit

The accounting currency unit is Vietnam Dong (VND) because payments and receipts of the Company and its subsidiary are primarily made in VND.

### III. ACCOUNTING STANDARDS AND SYSTEM

### 1. Accounting system

The Company and its subsidiary apply the Vietnamese Accounting Standards, the Vietnamese Enterprise Accounting System, which were issued together with the Circular No. 200/2014/TT-BTC dated 22 December 2014 on guidelines for accounting policies for enterprises, the Circular No. 53/2016/TT-BTC dated 21 March 2016, the Circular No. 202/2014/TT-BTC dated 22 December 2014 giving guidance on the preparation and presentation of Consolidated Financial Statements, as well as other Circulars guiding the implementation of the Vietnamese Accounting Standards of the Ministry of Finance in the preparation and presentation of Interim Consolidated Financial Statements.

### 2. Statement on the compliance with the Accounting Standards and System

The Board of Management ensures the compliance with all the requirements of the Vietnamese Accounting Standards, the Vietnamese Enterprise Accounting System, which were issued together with the Circular No. 200/2014/TT-BTC dated 22 December 2014, the Circular No. 53/2016/TT-BTC dated 21 March 2016, the Circular No. 202/2014/TT-BTC dated 22 December 2014 as well as other circulars guiding the implementation of the Vietnamese Accounting Standards of the Ministry of Finance in the preparation and presentation of Interim Consolidated Financial Statements.

### IV. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### 1. Basis of preparation of the Consolidated Financial Statements

All the Consolidated Financial Statements are prepared on the accrual basis (except for the information related to cash flows).

The Interim Consolidated Financial Statements have been prepared in both Vietnamese and English, in which the Interim Consolidated Financial Statements in Vietnamese are the official statutory financial statements of the Company and its subsidiary. The Interim Consolidated Financial Statements in English have been translated from the Vietnamese version. In the event of any discrepancy between the two versions, the Vietnamese version shall prevail.

### 2. Basis of consolidation

The Interim Consolidated Financial Statements include the Interim Combined Financial Statements of the Parent Company and the Interim Financial Statements of its subsidiary. A subsidiary is a business that is controlled by the Parent Company. The control exists when the Parent Company has the power to directly or indirectly govern the financial and operating policies of the subsidiary to obtain economic benefits from its activities. In determining the control power, the potential voting right arising from share call options, debt or equity instruments that are convertible into ordinary shares as of the end of the fiscal year shall be taken into consideration.

The Interim Financial Statements of the Parent Company and its subsidiary used for consolidation are prepared for the same accounting period and apply consistent accounting policies for similar transactions and events in similar circumstances. In case the subsidiary's accounting policies are different from those that are applied consistently within the Parent Company, the appropriate adjustments should be made to the subsidiary's Financial Statements before they are used to prepare the Interim Consolidated Financial Statements.

Intra-group balances in the balance sheet and intra-group transactions and unrealized intra-group gains or losses resulting from these transactions are eliminated when preparing the Interim Consolidated Financial Statements. Unrealized losses resulting from intra-group transactions are also eliminated unless costs that cause those losses cannot be recovered.

Non-controlling interests ("NCI") include the gains or losses of the subsidiary's operating results and net assets that are not held by the Company and are presented in a specific item in the Interim Consolidated Income Statement and the Interim Consolidated Balance Sheet (as a part of the owner's equity). NCI include the value of NCI at the date of initial business combination and those in the changes of owner's equity commencing from that date. Losses arising in the subsidiary are allocated to NCI based on the non-controlling shareholders' ownership rate in the subsidiary, even if those losses excess the non-controlling shareholders' ownership in the net assets of the subsidiary.

### 3. Cash

Cash includes cash on hand and demand deposits at banks.

### 4. Financial investments

### Held-to-maturity investments

Investments are classified as held-to-maturity investments that the Company and its subsidiary intend and are able to hold to maturity. Held-to-maturity investments of the Company and its subsidiary only include term deposits at banks. Interest income from these term deposits is recognized in the Income Statement on the accrual basis.

### Investments in equity instruments of other entities

Investments in equity instruments of other entities include such investments in equity instruments that do not enable the Company and its subsidiary to have the control, joint control or significant influence on these entities.

Investments in equity instruments of other entities are initially recognized at costs, including cost of purchase or capital contributions plus other directly attributable transaction costs. Dividends and profits of the periods prior to the acquisition of investments are deducted from the cost of such investments. Dividends and profits of the periods after the acquisition of such investments are recorded in the Company and its subsidiary's financial income. Particularly, stock dividends received are not recorded as an increase in value, but the increasing quantity of shares is followed up.

Provisions for impairment of investments in equity instruments of other entities are made as follows:

- For investments in listed shares or fair value of investments which is reliably measured, provisions are made based on the market value of shares.
- For investments of which the fair value cannot be measured at the time of reporting, provisions are made based on the losses suffered by investees, with the provision amount determined by the difference between owners' actual contributed capital and total owners' equity as of the balance sheet date multiplied (x) by the Company and its subsidiary's rate of charter capital owning in these investees.

Increases/ (decreases) in provisions for impairment of investments in equity instruments of other entities to be recognized as of the balance sheet date are recorded into "Financial expenses".

### 5. Receivables

Receivables are recognized at the carrying amount less allowance for doubtful debts.

The classification of receivables as trade receivables and other receivables is made according to the following principles:

- Trade receivables reflect receivables concerning the commercial nature arising from purchase and sale transactions between the Company and its subsidiary and customers who are independent to the Company and its subsidiary.
- Other receivables reflect receivables not concerning the commercial nature and irrelevant to purchase and sale transactions.

Allowance is made for each doubtful debt after being offset against liabilities (if any). The allowance rate is based on the estimated loss.

Increases/ (decreases) in allowance for doubtful debts to be recognized as of the balance sheet date are recorded into "General and administration expenses".

### 6. **Inventories**

Inventories are recognized at the lower of cost and net realizable value.

Costs of inventories are determined as follows:

- For materials: Costs comprise costs of purchases and other directly attributable costs incurred in bringing the inventories to their present location and conditions.
- For work in progress ("WIP"): Costs comprise costs of main materials, labor and other directly attributable costs. WIP of each construction contract is determined as follows:

Ending balance of Beginning balance Costs incurred during Cost of sales during WIP of WIP the period the period In which: The cost of sales for the project is determined by multiplying the revenue recognized in the period by the project's fixed cost ratio.

The cost of inventories is determined using the weighted average method and recorded in accordance with the perpetual inventory system.

Net realizable value is the estimated selling price of inventories in the ordinary course of business less the estimated costs of completion and the estimated costs necessary to make the sale.

Allowance for inventories is recognized for each type of inventories, each construction project in progress when their costs are higher than their net realizable value. Increases/ (decreases) in allowance for inventories to be recognized as of the balance sheet date are recorded into "Costs of sales".

### 7. Prepaid expenses

Prepaid expenses comprise actual expenses arising and relevant to financial performance in several accounting periods. These prepaid expenses are allocated over the period in which corresponding economic benefits are generated from these expenses, within 36 months.

### 8. Operating leased assets

A lease is classified as an operating lease if significant risks and rewards associated with the ownership belong to the lessor. The lease expenses are allocated to operating expenses using the straight-line method over the lease term, regardless of the method of lease payment.

### 9. Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are determined by their historical costs less accumulated depreciation. Historical costs of tangible fixed assets include all the expenses paid by the Company and its subsidiary to bring the asset to its working condition for its intended use. Other expenses arising subsequent to initial recognition are included into historical costs of fixed assets only if it can be clearly demonstrated that the expenditure has resulted in future economic benefits expected to be obtained from the use of these assets. Those which do not meet the above conditions will be recorded into operating costs during the period.

When a tangible fixed asset is sold or disposed, its historical cost and accumulated depreciation are written off, then any gain or loss arising from such disposal is included in the income or the expenses during the period.

Tangible fixed assets are depreciated using the straight-line method over their estimated useful lives. The depreciation years applied are as follows:

### 10. Payables and accrued expenses

Payables and accrued expenses are recorded based on the amounts payable for merchandise and services already used. Accrued expenses are recorded based on reasonable estimates for the amounts payable.

The classification of payables as trade payables, accrued expenses, and other payables is made on the basis of following principles:

- Trade payables reflect payables of commercial nature arising from the purchase of merchandise, services, or assets and the seller is an independent entity with the Company and its subsidiary;
- Accrued expenses reflect expenses for merchandise, services received from suppliers or supplied to customers but have not been paid, invoiced or lack of accounting records and supporting documents; pay on leave payable to employees; and accrual of operating expenses;
- Other payables reflect payables of non-commercial nature and irrelevant to purchase, sales of merchandise or rendering of services.

Payables and accrued expenses are classified into short-term and long-term ones in the Interim Consolidated Balance Sheet based on the remaining terms as of the balance sheet date.

### 11. Owner's equity

### Owner's contribution capital

Owner's contribution capital is recorded according to the actual amounts invested by the shareholders of the Parent Company.

### Other sources of capital

Other sources of capital are due to the supplementation from business profits, revaluation of assets and fair value of the assets gifted, granted or sponsored to the Company after deducting taxes payable (if any) related to these assets.

### Treasury shares

When the Company reacquires its own equity instrument, purchasing costs including the expenses related to the transaction are recorded as treasury shares and shall be deducted from owner's equity. When treasury shares are re-issued, the difference between their re-issuance price and carrying value is recorded in share premiums.

### 12. Profit distribution

Profit after tax is distributed to the shareholders after appropriation to funds under the Charter of the Company and its subsidiary as well as legal regulations and approved by the General Meeting of Shareholders.

The distribution of profits to the shareholders is made in consideration of non-cash items in retained earnings that may affect cash flows and the ability to pay dividends such as gains from revaluation of assets invested in other entities, gains from revaluation of monetary items, financial instruments and other non-cash items.

Dividends are recorded as payables upon approval of the General Meeting of Shareholders.

### 13. Recognition of revenue and income

### Revenue from sales of merchandise, finished goods

Revenue from sales of merchandise, finished goods shall be recognized when all of the following conditions are satisfied:

- The Company and its subsidiary have transferred most of risks and benefits incident to the ownership of merchandise or products to the customer.
- The Company and its subsidiary retain neither continuing managerial involvement to the degree usually associated with ownership nor effective control over the merchandise, products sold.
- The amount of revenue can be measured reliably. When the contract stipulates that the buyer has right to return merchandise, products purchased under specific conditions, revenue is recognized only when those specific conditions no longer exist and the buyer retains no right to return merchandise, products (except for the case that the customer has the right to return the merchandise or products in exchange for other merchandise or services).
- It is probable that the economic benefits associated with sale transactions will flow to the Company and its subsidiary.
- The cost incurred or to be incurred in respect of the sale transaction can be measured reliably.

### Revenue from rendering of services

Revenue from rendering of services shall be recognized when all of the following conditions are satisfied:

- The amount of revenue can be measured reliably. When the contract stipulates that the buyer is
  entitled to return the services rendered under specific conditions, revenue is recognized only
  when those specific conditions no longer exist and the buyer is not entitled to return the
  services rendered.
- The Company and its subsidiary received or shall probably receive the economic benefits associated with the rendering of services.
- The stage of completion of the transaction at the end of reporting period can be measured reliably.
- The costs incurred for the transaction and the costs to complete the transaction can be measured reliably.

In the case that the services are rendered in several accounting periods, revenue is recognized on the basis of the stage of completion as of the balance sheet date.

### Interest

Interest is recorded based on the term and the actual interest rate applied in each particular period.

### Dividend income

Dividend income is recognized when the Company and its subsidiary have the right to receive dividends from the investees. Particularly, stock dividends received are not recorded as an increase in value, but the increasing quantity of shares is followed up.

### 14. Construction contracts

A construction contract is written contract for the construction of an asset or combination of assets which are closely interrelated or interdependent in terms of their design, technology, function or basic use purposes.

When the outcome of the construction contracts is estimated reliably: For the construction contract stipulating that the contractor is paid based on the value of performed work volume, revenue and related costs are recognized in proportion to the work completed, as confirmed by the customer and reflected in the issued invoices.

Variation in amount of contract work done, compensation receivables and other receivables are recognized into revenue only when these are accepted by customers.

When the outcome of the construction contracts cannot be estimated reliably:

- Revenue is only recognized to the extent of contract costs incurred, where recovery is reasonably certain.
- Contract costs are recognized as expenses when they are incurred.

### 15. Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs are interest expenses and other costs that the Company and its subsidiary directly incur in connection with the borrowings. Borrowing costs are recorded as expenses when incurred.

### 16. Expenses

Expenses are those that result in outflows of the Company and its subsidiary's economic benefits and are recorded at the time of transactions or when incurrence of the transaction is reliable regardless of whether payment for expenses is made or not.

Expenses and their corresponding revenue are simultaneously recognized in accordance with matching principle. In the event that matching principle conflicts with prudence principle, expenses are recognized based on the nature and regulations of accounting standards in order to guarantee that transactions can be fairly and truly reflected.

### 17. Corporate income tax

Corporate income tax includes current income tax and deferred income tax.

### Current income tax

Current income tax is the tax amount computed based on the taxable income. Taxable income is different from accounting profit due to the adjustments of temporary differences between tax and accounting figures, non-deductible expenses as well as those of non-taxable income and losses brought forward.

### Deferred income tax

Deferred income tax is the amount of corporate income tax payable or refundable due to temporary differences between book value of assets and liabilities serving the preparation of the Financial Statements and the value for tax purposes. Deferred income tax liabilities are recognized for all the temporary taxable differences. Deferred income tax assets are recorded only when there is an assurance on the availability of taxable income in the future against which the temporarily deductible differences can be used.

Book value of deferred corporate income tax assets is considered as of the balance sheet date and will be reduced to the rate that ensures enough taxable income against which the benefits from part of or all of the deferred income tax can be used. Deferred corporate income tax assets, which have not been recorded before, are considered as of the balance sheet date and are recorded when there is certainly enough taxable income to use these unrecognized deferred corporate income tax assets.

Deferred income tax assets and deferred income tax liabilities are determined at the estimated rate to be applied in the year when the assets are recovered or the liabilities are settled based on the effective tax rates as of the balance sheet date. Deferred income tax is recognized in the Income Statement. In the case that deferred income tax is related to the items of the owner's equity, corporate income tax will be included in the owner's equity.

The Company and its subsidiary shall offset deferred tax assets and deferred tax liabilities when:

- The Company and its subsidiary have the legal right to offset current income tax assets against current income tax liabilities; and
- Deferred income tax assets and deferred income tax liabilities are relevant to corporate income tax which is under the management of one tax authority either:
  - Of the same subject to corporate income tax; or
  - The Company and its subsidiary have intention to pay current income tax liabilities and current income tax assets on a net basis or recover tax assets and settle tax liabilities simultaneously in each future period to the extent that the majority of deferred income tax liabilities or deferred income tax assets are paid or recovered.

### 18. Related parties

Parties are considered to be related parties in case that one party is able to control the other party or has significant influence on the financial and operating decisions of the other party. Parties are also considered to be related parties in case that they are under the common control or under the common significant influence.

In considering each possible related party relationship, attention is directed to the substance of the relationship and not merely the legal form.

### 19. Segment reporting

A business segment is a distinguishable component of the Company and its subsidiary that is engaged in manufacturing or providing products or services and that is subject to risks and returns that are different from those of other business segments.

A geographical segment is a distinguishable component of the Company and its subsidiary that is engaged in manufacturing or providing products or services within a particular economic environment and that is subject to risks and returns that are different from those of components operating in other economic environments.

The segment information is prepared and presented in conformity with the accounting policy applied for the preparation and presentation of the Company and its subsidiary's Interim Consolidated Financial Statements.

### V. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ON THE ITEMS OF THE INTERIM CONSOLIDATED BALANCE SHEET

### 1. Cash and cash equivalents
